Leadership means Belief and Faith

Two powerful words are belief and faith. Imagine yourself on the bridge of a ship. The year is 1492. Suddenly there's a cry from the crow's nest, "Land ahoy!" There ahead lies America, and the first men from the European continent will soon step ashore.

The captain of this small squadron of ships is Christopher Columbus, a remarkable man of strong intellect, great courage, and, above all, a profound sense of belief in himself and his mission.

Remember, at the time when Columbus sailed, most of the educated world then believed that the world was flat. "Why," exclaimed most men, "anyone can see that. Just look at the sea and you know the world is flat. Sail too far, and you'll fall off the end." You see, that was the reality of that day's world as men were conditioned to see it, as they believed it to be.

But Columbus believed differently. His problem was to get others to believe the world was round and that

there were new continents to be explored. Just imagine how he had to sell his idea – first, to the queen, then to the bankers of his day, then to the crew to man his ships. This was a skeptical idea, at best, in a time when the perceived “truth” was like a map – a land mass here and there, with oceans in between. But all was FLAT!

Here is where faith became vital because faith through belief causes people to see beyond what they perceive and believe at the time. In other words, belief without evidence is called faith.

Well, you know what happened. The queen had faith in Columbus, and sold her royal jewels so he could build his ships. The crew had faith in Columbus, and they agreed to sail with him. The rest is history.

Do you believe enough in yourself so that others will follow you with faith? That's the sign of real leadership. Does it show in your confidence, in your poise, in the way you look and act? People will believe in you if first you believe in yourself. Each individual must stand up for those things he believes in, regardless of the praise or blame of those around him. Yes, if you believe you can – or you can't – you're right! Keep this in mind when you celebrate the birthday of Christopher Columbus. In fact keep it in mind all year long.
